With Thanksgiving fast approaching, I am reminded of how thankful I am for the many blessings of my church family, who give so much of themselves to the work and mission of helping others in need.

On June 20th, we participated in a walk to raise awareness for Mitochondrial Disease, a condition in which mitochondria fail to produce enough energy for cells or organs to function properly. Mitochondrial Disease affects 1 in 4,300 people globally, and every 30 minutes, a child is born who will develop a Mitochondrial Disorder by the age of 10.

Throughout the summer, we continued to gather at the church to create dresses for girls in Ghana, in partnership with the Whitney Point U.M.C. To date, over 200 dresses have been made—many thanks to the efforts of Blanche Birtch, Carol Carpenetti, Cindy Finney, Sheri Hotaling, Carol Prentice, Jill Skinner, Terry Walker and Geri Tow. Our next church gatherings for this project are October 20th, and November 3rd and 17th in Fellowship Hall from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Even if you have no sewing experience, we would love your help with ironing and cutting fabric. Many thanks to Carol Holland and Sheri Hotaling for donating two sewing machines.

On September 8th, we served 98 scalloped potato and ham dinners at Fairview U.M.C. to the Binghamton Community. Did you know that Broome County has the highest poverty rate of the 53 upstate New York counties, with 20.8% of residents living below the poverty line? This is a quarterly project to help feed those in need, and we welcome volunteers. Special thanks to Carol Carpenetti and Wendy Eggleston for their culinary expertise, creating an extraordinary meal from Fairview's food pantry. Other workers included Sue Bennett, Blanche and Tom Birtch, Craig Cartner, and Asia Quinn, our High School volunteer.

This year, we are excited to host a Free Community Thanksgiving Dinner on Thursday, November 27th from 1:30 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. at Windsor United Methodist Church. I hope you will prayerfully consider giving of your time to help those in our own community. A sign-up sheet for volunteer opportunities will be posted in the Narthex, and we encourage you to help spread the word. Many thanks to Karen Bixby for designing our Thanksgiving Day flyer.

We will also be collecting items for our annual "Red Bird Mission" shoeboxes. Please see the attached handout for a list of items to be collected. New this year, we will serve as the "Eastern Broome County Center," where neighboring churches can drop off completed shoeboxes. From there, we will deliver them to Endwell U.M.C. Shoebox items will be collected until Sunday, November 16th.

Lastly and on a personal note of reflection, let us remember that Galatians 6:9 (NLT) reminds us: "Let us not grow weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up." Let's keep moving forward, Windsor U.M.C., and never give up!




